Hospital increases charged to paying customers to offset uncompensated costs







If I decide that I want to cancel this authorization, I must do so in writing directly to my provider. My cancellation for any reason will not apply to confidential information that has already been shared with HASA members.
I understand that if I cancel this Authorization, it may take up to 72 hours (3 days) for this cancellation to be processed and effective. After that, information about me that is shared will be locked in the computer and cannot be viewed by the providers.
I HAVE A RIGHT TO SEE MY RECORDS I understand that if I sign this Authorization, I have a right to keep a copy of it and to see what information has been shared because of it. If I want to see my records, I must ask my health care provider and not HASA. I also understand that I may have to pay a fee for copies.






Reporting Design

SecureShare capture Medically Uninsured



Uninsured- Chronic Disease Prevalence




ER visits

SecureShare shows that:

- In 2007, uninsured people with a Diabetes diagnosis visited ER on average .1 more times; out of a total of 102,123 ER visits, this equates 10,212 more visits
- People with Diabetes and Hypertension diagnosis had same ER visit prevalence

ER visits- Frequent Flyers




ER visits- Frequent Flyers traits

- Among FF little use of community clinics
- Presence of mental health & substance present but not yet quantifiable
- Identified people have additional hospital visits other than ER visits

Frequent Flyers Analysis Opportunity

- Triage & Case manage towards community health sources
- Secure share to be deployed in ER setting in order to obtain patient authorization
- Determine financial support opportunities
- Quantify cost savings from care triage
- Linkage with mental health services
