Q: Is it possible to add a public IP to a SAN certificate? Private IP addresses and internal names are no longer allowed, but can you perform DCV on a public IP and add it?

A: Yes, you can use a public IP in a SAN. It can be done for most certificate types available on the console. Add it as if it is a new domain as you stated.
