



EUMEDCONNECT Research and Education network project 2004 -2014 (3 phases), 14M Euro of EC funding

The only regional Research and Educational Network in the Arab Region

National Research and Education Networks in Algeria (ARN), Egypt (EUN), Tunisia (CCK), Jordan (JUNET), Morocco (MARWAN), Palestine (PALNET) and Syria (HIAST) were connected to its European counterpart GÉANT Print



### **The EUMEDCONNECT3**

- A new phase EUMEDCONNECT3 runs 2011 2014
- Co-ordinating Partners: DANTE and ASREN
- So far Algeria & Palestine are connected using EUMEDCONNECT funding
- Scheme is open to: Egypt, Jordan, Lebanon, Libya, Morocco, Syria, Tunisia
- Opportunity to extend the network to other Arab countries
- A first step towards a Pan-Arab network for research and education

# **One Year of History (2010)**

- ASREN was proposed in Cairo, January 2010, by Arab NRENs during the EUMEDCONNECT2/EUMEDGRID Support Meetings.
- Announced in Brussels March 2010 During the 3<sup>rd</sup> EUMEDEVENT.
- Planning meetings were conducted during the EUMEDCONNECT2/EUMEDGRID Support meetings in Algeria (July 2010) and Rome (November 2010)

 Launched in the League of Arab States in Cairo under the Patronage of HE Amre Moussa, December 2010. and Chaired by HE Talal Abu Ghazaleh with high level participation



# 2011, A year of achievements

- ASREN was present in many activities and events around the world addressing the research and education communities, specially the Arab World.
- ASREN was officially registered in Germany as a non profit GmbH with 3 shareholders (JUNet of Jordan, CNRST of Morocco and Talal Abu Ghazaleh Consulting GmbH)
- ASREN became official partner in the EUMEDCONNECT3 project which aims to provide connectivity to the Arab-Med countries to GEANT
- ASREN is partner with CHAIN project which aims to coordinate and harmonize the e-Infrastructures around.
- ASREN conducted and participated in several workshops in Lebanon, Malta, UAE, Tanzania, Czech Republic, France, Egypt and more

# **The e-AGE 2011**

- The 1<sup>st</sup> International Platform on Integrating Arab e-infrastructure in a Global Environment, e-AGE2011, conducted in Amman December 2011 under the Royal Patronage.
- The conference was attended by high level representatives including Ministers and decision makers, academics, network professionals, researchers, scientists from 32 countries.
- The event included:
  - EUMED Event 4
  - Internet2 SIG Middle East Meeting
  - ASREN 1st Annual Meeting
- 11 Arab NRENs were present and 8 NRENs signed letters of accord to start joining ASREN

### **ASREN Shareholders:**

- 8 NRENs signed Letter of Accord with ASREN during the e-AGE2011 in Amman to start the process of joining ASREN.
- Algeria was the first to start the process of joining ASREN, unfortunately,
   CERIST is not allowed sign as a shareholder based on the Algerian Law.
   Layer of ASREN is working on other alternatives for Algeria.
- Sudan is now a full ASREN
- Somalia, Palestine and later Tunisia started the official process to join
   ASREN as a shareholder.
- ASREN is approaching and following up with other Arab NRENs.

### Connectivity

- Unfortunately, Only Palestine and Algeria are now connected through the EUMEDCONNECT3 project.
- Other Partners are not connected due to financial related issues
   Details in the EUMEDCONNECT3 session.
- ASREN is investigating other scenarios for establishing the Network and providing connectivity.
- For this purpose, ASREN approached several worldwide and regional cable owners and operators and opening dialogue with Ubuntunet Alliance to discuss collaboration.

- Minister of Higher Education in Tunisia praises ASREN and commends on its role
- HE, Moncef Bin Salem Received Yousef Torman, Managing Director of ASREN and Mohamed Jemni, General Manager of CCK, Tunisia and discussed with them the importance of ASREN as an opportunity for developing the collaboration in research and education in the Arab World. He aslo decided to have CCK as a shareholder of ASREN.





### Funding

- ASREN prepared a Multi Stake Holder Concept Document and shared with the World Bank, Internet2 and the EC to start a pilot project to
  - Conduct a study on the infrastructure availability to be used in establishing the Regional Arab Network, and
    - To implement pilot project to:
    - Establish NREN in some selected Arab Countries
    - Develop Some selected NRENs and
    - Establish a regional connectivity between these countries.
- Submitted Proposal to the Connect-Arab- Summit
- Approaching ITU and the Arab Internet Governance Forum



#### **Grid Site at Kuwait University**

Kuwait University with ASREN had implemented and installed a Grid Site in Kuwait University as a pilot project and makes it a part of the ASREN Arab Grid infrastructure. A full grid site with all related services is installed and configured at Kuwait University. This KU Grid Node extends the collaboration between ASREN and Kuwait University and further connects the users in Kuwait University to ASREN Grid.


